NOTE: Organized as 13<sup>th</sup> Missouri Infantry in Jun 1861. Redesignated 25<sup>th</sup> Missouri Infantry in Sep 1861. Consolidated with Bissell's Engineer Regiment of the West to form 1<sup>st</sup> Missouri Engineers on 17 Feb 1864.
