**ABRAMS TANK**

The M-1 main battle tank program began Sep 1972. After experimentation and testing, the Chrysler Corporation won the production contract in Nov 1977 and the Army accepted the first production models in Feb 1980. Christened "General Abrams," the tanks became standard and classified as the M-1 main battle tank. Full-scale production began in 1981. See:
