ENEMY ARMOR

Enemy armor engaged in combat on only four recorded occasions during the period of U.S. ground combat in Vietnam, 1964-72. The first battlefield appearance of enemy armor occurred during the successful attack on the U.S. Special Forces camp at Lang Vei, near Khe Sanh, 6-7 Feb 1968. The combined infantry-armor attack involved about 12 Russian-built PT-76 light tanks. See:
