KOREAN WAR-Infantry Counterfire Platoons

Numbered infantry counterfire platoons were not organic to regiments, but were separate TOE units assigned or attached to divisions and perhaps higher echelons of command. Each standard infantry regiment in the Korean War included an unnumbered counterfire platoon in its headquarters company. See TOE 7-12N, 21 Apr 1948, p. 2, and its Change 3, 15 Nov 1950, p. 4. Also, see FM 7-25, dated 1950, pp. 22-93 for details on personnel duties and operational techniques of the regimental counterfire platoon, one of the successors of the WWII sound-ranging units.
