

UNION BLOCKADE OF CONFEDERATE PORTS, 1861-1865

A Working Bibliography of MHI Sources

Implemented by Presidential Proclamation on 17 Apr 1861, which increased in scope during the course of the war, Federal forces attempted a blockade of Confederate oceanic and river shipping. Ships attempting to enter or leave would be first warned; if resistance ensued, they would be captured and confiscated.
