-Provisional Cavalry Squadron, AFG

Organized 3 Jul 1919 as the Mounted Detachment, AFG, from various elements of Former Third Army. LTC Jonathan M. Wainwright, later of Bataan fame, served as the unit's first commander. Although intended for show purposes, it was mobilized 18 Nov 1919 by AFG's CG Henry T. Allen in response to Germans assembling forces at Altenkirchen, Hachenburg, and Marienburg. Excelling in sports, the unit won honors in baseball, football, and polo. In Oct 1921, the designation "Mounted Detachment," became "Provisional Cavalry Squadron." See:
