Subsequent proceedings at Nuremberg involved 12 trials of Nazi war criminals beginning 26 Oct 1946 until 14 Apr 1949. Each trial focused on a different group of Third Reich officials. The most famous trial of the 12 was Case 9, Einsatzgruppen Case (Extermination Squads), in which 15 of the 24 defendants were sentenced to death. See:
