SIBERIAN EXPEDITION-Alleged Massacre, 1919

A combat action occurred 25 Jun 1919 at Romanovka, which some consider a massacre. A detachment or platoon of Co A, 31st Infantry, commanded by LT Lawrence D. Butler, fought with numerous Bolshevik irregulars (miners from Petrovka and Novo Roskaya). American losses were 19 killed and 25 wounded, of whom five later died--a death toll of almost half the unit's strength. See:
