### **NOTE-First German Sub Sunk**

On 9 Aug 1914, just four days after war began, U-15 was destroyed by British cruiser HMS Birmingham in the North Sea, off Fair Isle, Great Britain. Adrift with engines evidently broken down, the submarine was then rammed at full speed, splitting it in two. It sank with all of the crew. See:
