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WORLD WAR I & AFTER (1917-1939)

The AEF overseas established a program of non-military education after the 11 Nov 1918 armistice. Intended to raise morale during the slow demobilization, this program featured a wide variety of educational opportunities, including post schools, extension service, correspondence courses, and the AEF University at Beaune, Cote D'Or, France.

Meanwhile, the Army as a whole also developed a post-armistice general education program that included vocational and literacy training for the citizen-soldiers of the expanded Army. In Sep 1919 special education and recreation staff officers were appointed by commanders and held responsible for the local programs. In 1921 a re-invigorated post school system conducted educational instruction under regulations not rescinded until 1939. See:

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
