Pertinent unit histories and other materials revealed no mention of shotguns. Tables of organization and equipment of 1918 infantry units do not include such weapons. A raid plan of the 1st Div's 3d Bn, 26th Inf, dated 15 Jun 1918 (05-1-1928v10), includes no shotguns in the "Arms & Equipment Section." That plan, incidentally, typifies dozens more prepared by elements of the 1st and 2d Divs on file. None mentions shotguns. After the war, in summarizing lessons learned, the A.E.F. Board on Tactics and Organization did not include shotguns in its recommended list of armaments. See pp. 21-22 of its report (UA25A11). See also:
