The only major German offensive on the Western Front in 1915 opened with the discharge of 168 tons of chlorine gas against French (Territorial and Algerian) and Canadian troops east of the Ypres Salient. The gas attacks, which commenced 22 Apr near Langemarck, continued through May, pushing the British lines to the suburbs of Ypres.
