## **BATTLE OF KURSK (OPERATION CITADEL), 1943**

### A Working Bibliography of MHI Sources

Reputedly the greatest tank battle ever fought until Operation Desert Storm (Feb 92). Kursk involved approximately 6,000-6,500 AFV's, with about 1/4 to 1/2 actually engaged at any one time (cf. 10,000 AFV's in the Kuwait-Iraq area.) Most sources cited below seem to agree that the Germans had slightly less than half the total, while the Russians had slightly more--perhaps 2,700 German & 3,500 Russian vehicles.
