

TROOP REDEPLOYMENT, 1945: ETO to Pacific

Although combat ended in the ETO in May 1945, the war against Japan continued in the Pacific Theater for 3 more months. During this interval, redeployment entailed transferring individuals & units from Europe to East Asia via the US, where rest and retraining would occur before final redeployment to the Pacific Theater.
