# 475<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY REGIMENT (MERRILL'S MARAUDERS)

### A <u>Working</u> Bibliography of MHI Sources

Originally codenamed Galahad Force, this special long-range penetration force trained and operated in Burma alongside British forces, 1943-44. Designated 1688<sup>th</sup> Casual Detachment, then 5307<sup>th</sup> Composite Unit (Provisional), in late 1944 it was designated the 475<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment.
